V.S.R.A. GENERAL BY-LAWS 13-12-79

DEFINITIONS:

- 'The Pennant Committee' means the Pennant Committee of the Association controlling the competition.
- "The Association" means the Association controlling the pennant competition.
- "The Council" means the Council of the Victorian Squash Rackets Association. "The Pennant Competitions Committee" is as defined in Clause 9 (k) (vii) of the V.S.R.A. Constitution.

Interpretation of By-Laws.

The Pennant Competitions Committee shall be responsible for the interpretation of the By-Laws. However, Council shall be the final authority for such interpreta-

2. Penalties for Breaches of By-Laws.

(a) The Association shall have the power to impose penalties for the breach of any of these By-Laws, by any of the following form(s):

disqualification, suspension, fine, the awarding of any rubber or match to the opposing team, and/or the deduction of points already scored.

The Pennant Committee will adjudicate on matters relating to pennant and involving fines and/or loss of points. All other matters shall be referred to a Pennant Tribunal which shall adjudicate on all matters which are referred to it by a Pennant Committee. The members of the Tribunal shall be the Victorian Pennant Co-ordinator and/or State Pennant Chairmen and/or Metropolitan Association Chairmen. The chair shall be taken by either the Victorian Pennant Co-ordinator or a State Pennant Chairman. A quorum shall be three (3) persons entitled to vote. A pennant committee's representative(s) may not vote on any matter which that pennant committee has referred to the Tribunal for adjudication.

The Tribunal shall meet within seven (7) days of a request for adjudication on any matter relating to the pennant squash By-Laws.

(b) Any member or any person who is a member of a club which is a member of the Association or any person who is associated with any pennant team who is present at any squash centre when any pennant match is being played or its associated events are being conducted and who aids, abets, counsels or procures or who is a party to the commission of any breach of these By-Laws (or the constitution of the V.S.R.A.) shall be liable to a penalty as is the principal of-

Amounts Payable for each particular fine.

The various amounts payable for fines imposed for breaches of By-Laws shall be set annually by Council and advised to members.

Procedure for Appeals against Decisions.

(a) Any appeal by a member against an interpretation or decision by the Pennant Committee under these By-Laws must be lodged in writing with the Secretary of the Council within seven (7) days from the notification of such decision.

(b) If an appeal against disqualification or suspension is correctly lodged, the disqualified or suspended team or member shall not be debarred from taking part in matches until the appeal has been heard. Should the appeal not be upheld the decision of the Pennant Committee shall be enforced as from the date of the original notification of the decision to the disqualified or suspended team or member, or such date as the Association decides. Penalty for Non-Payment of Fines.

Any member not paying the full amount of any fine imposed under these By-Laws to the Secretary of the Association within thirty (30) days after the notification of the imposition of such fine shall, unless it has appealed within the specified time of seven (7) days, be penalised under the provisions of By-Law 2.

Procedure for Protests Alleging Breaches of By-Laws.

Protests alleging breaches of these By-Laws must be lodged in writing with the

Secretary or Pennant Chairman of the Association within seven (7) days of the occurrence of the alleged breach.

Power to Demand Information.

The Pennant Committee shall have the power at any time to demand from any member information regarding the circumstances under which any match has

been played, or respecting any matters relating thereto.

Members to Provide Officials and Courts as Required.

(a) Any members entering teams in any V.S.R.A. Pennant Competition may be required to make available referees, markers and officials for the Finals series of the Pennant Competitions, the Australian and Victorian Championships, and any other matches held by the V.S.R.A.

(b) If required by the Association all members must make courts available for a maximum of one match in the final series for each two teams entered in the com-

PENNANT COMPETITION BY-LAWS

Rules and Etiquette of the Game.

Matches shall be played under the rules of the game of Squash rackets as determined by the International Squash Rackets Federation, the interpretation of which shall devolve upon the council unless otherwise indicated by these By-Laws, and players shall observe the etiquette of the game and refrain from unseemly or improper behaviour on and off the court while present at a pennant match and its associated events.

10. Standard of Courts.

Within the time limits specified by Council all squash courts to be used for pennant competitions must comply with the standards set down by the Council.

Eligibility of Amateurs and Professionals.

Amateur players, registered professionals and registered associate professionals only may compete in pennant competitions.

12. Eligibility of Players.

(a) To be eligible to play in a pennant competition, each nominated player must be a bona-fide club member of the member by which they are nominated.(b) No player shall be eligible for nomination for more than one member during any one season of each pennant competition. Mid-Week Pennant Competition is separate to Friday, Saturday and Sunday Pennant Competitions

(c) No player shall be eligible to play before his nomination has been approved by the Pennant Committee.

Financial Requirements and Registration of Players.

The financial requirements as determined anually by the Council for the acceptance of members teams and players in competitions shall be as follows: Each member shall pay:

(a) an affiliation fee for the current year.
(b) an entrance fee for each team entered in each competition.

14. Transfers and Limitation of Play in Competition.

(a) A player transferring from one member to another may not be nominated for a competition unless the transfer is lodged with the Secretary of the Association by the gaining member no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the date of closure of team entries. Such a transfer must be endorsed by the Executive of the releasing member prior to submission to the Secretary.

No transfer is required if a player resumes pennant play after an absence of two

(b) Excepting as provided for in (a) no player having been nominated to play for any member shall be allowed to transfer to another member, or if a member has entered two teams in the same grade, to change from one team to another without the express sanction of the Pennant Committee. Transfers between associations must be approved by the Pennant Committees of both associations. Further, no player will be permitted to play with more than one team in the same round of a pennant competition.

(c) A member has no right to refuse transfers complying with the foregoing conditions, excepting where just cause is demonstrated to the Association.

(a) Team entries for pennant competitions must be in the form laid down by the Association and be in the hands of the Secretary of the Association by the dates set down. Any club may be liable to a fine if a player it enters at a No. 1 position in a team does not play in at least 1/3rd of the matches at that position

(b) All nominated teams must include a minimum number of five (5) registered players listed in order of merit. The exceptions to the above are the club's top team which may have four (4) players where the next team is graded within two grades below or at the discretion of the Pennant Committee.

Power to Restrict Teams, Grade Teams and Determine the Number of Grades.

(a) The Association shall have the right to restrict the number of teams or refuse the entry of teams, from any member and then decide the grading thereof.

(b) Teams entering the mid-week pennant competition shall be graded into no more than twenty grades of differing standards. The highest grades (maximum of eight) shall be known as State Grades and the remaining grades (maximum of

twelve) shall be divided into regional areas as decided by the Council. The Names First, Second, Third and so on shall be used to distinguish each consecutive grade in the State Grade competition, whereas the names A, A Reserve, B, B Reserve and so on shall be used in the regional area competi-

(c) If the number of teams entering each regional area exceeds the number required to complete the grades, each successive grade shall be divided into sections, in general starting from the bottom grade until the number of teams entered are all included. This method of determining sections within grades may be varied in exceptional circumstances.

(d) The State Grades may also be divided into sections.

(e) If at the time of grading the number of teams entered in the competition does not divide into an exact number of grades and sections, a maximum of one bye less than the number of teams in a section shall be allocated.

(f) Except in State "First Grade" where no member may have more than one team in the grade unless the member gains the right under By-Laws 34 no member may have more than two teams in any section of any grade.

(g) The Council shall allocate members to each regional area as it sees fit.

(h) Any member withdrawing a nominated team from a competition after the gradings have been determined shall be liable for a fine.

Order of Merit.

Prior to the commencement of the first round of the competition, each member must submit a graded list of players in order of merit comprising every registered player of their club and this order of merit shall form the basis of selection of all teams entered by the member. No alteration to this graded order of players will be permitted except as provided for in By-Law 18. When required, emergencies must be taken from a member's next available grade below. Any newly registered player, who was not included in the member's original nomination of teams for grading, can only be included in a team with the permission of the Pennant Committee. Such inclusions will not be permitted to strengthen a team beyond the standard of the particular grade.

Alteration to Order of Merit.

(a) The Pennant Committee has the right to alter the order of merit of any member at any time. No alteration to order of merit will be permitted without the permission of the Pennant Committee.

(b) If a member considers that the order of merit need adjusting, details of the proposed adjustment and the request to alter the order of the team must be received in writing from the Secretary of the Club before the last match of the first half pennant season.

In considering alterations to the order of merit, members should note that only in exceptional circumstances will a player who has achieved more wins than losses playing in a particular position in the team in matches during the first half pennant season be permitted to play in a lower position in the second half pennant season of matches. If approved, the new order of players will be effective as from the first match of the second half pennant season and remain effective until the completion of the competition, including the final series.

Duties of Home Team.

The home club shall supply the court and at least one new squash ball of a type approved by the Council. The home team shall fulfil any other hosting requirements set down by the association.

Composition of Teams and Selection of Opponent.

Four registered players from each team shall compete and each player shall play a rubber against one of the opposing team. The members of each team shall be arranged in the order consistent with the order of merit of their club, and in every case No. 1 player of one team shall play No. 1 player of the opposing team, No. 2 play No. 2, No. 3 play No. 3, and No. 4 play No. 4.

Pennant Match Procedure.

(a) Captains must advise their opposing captains the composition of their teams before the commencement of any match.

(b) Each rubber shall be the best of five games played according to the rules of

Squash Rackets and these By-Laws.

(c) The playing order of the rubbers in all grades shall be decided by tossing of a coin. The team captain winning the toss shall nominate the players for the first rubber, and thereafter captains alternate choice of subsequent rubbers. Subsequent rubbers must be nominated prior to the commencement of the last game. All eight players nominated for the match should be present at the commencement time unless otherwise agreed by team captains.

22. Dispute Over Playing Order.

In the event of any dispute over the playing order of a team, the match shall be played under protest and the Pennant Committee, shall determine the matter on receipt of a protest submitted according to these By-Laws.

23. Starting Time and Place For Playing Matches.

All matches shall be played at the places approved by the Association, and shall commence at the time approved by the Association. If play is not commenced within 15 minutes of the time laid down, the team offended against may claim the rubber by default.

A quarter-hour's grace shall be allowed after each rubber for the succeeding rubber to start. If play does not commence at the expiration of such grace, the team offended against may claim the particular rubber or rubbers also. However, if a rubber is played after the expiration of the 15 minutes period of grace, the team offended against must advise the team at fault of its intention to claim that rubber prior to the playing thereof, otherwise the result of the playing of the rubber shall stand. If both teams default in entirety the match shall be cancelled.

24. Variation in Place and Date of Play.

No alteration shall be made in the places and dates set down unless with the previous consent of the Pennant Committee. Should a match not be played as so arranged, then the team in default shall be deemed to have been defeated, provided, however, that the question as to whether a team is in default or not shall be decided by the Pennant Committee.

25. Power to Order Replay or Alter Time of Match.

The Pennant Committee or Pennant Tribunal shall have power to order any match to be replayed, either wholly or in part, and to alter the time for playing any match

6. Marking and Refereeing.

Marking and refereeing of pennant matches shall be carried out by the members of each team unless otherwise agreed by the team captain, or as directed by the Pennant Committee. A person from each team, nominated by their respective team captains, shall officiate at each rubber, the roles of marking and refereeing being alternated for each consecutive rubber.

NOTE: If the captains fail to agree, the roles of marking and refereeing of the

first rubber shall be decided by the toss of a coin.

27. Substitute Player in Special Circumstances. Where a match has commenced, and a team member nominated as per By-Law 21 is unable to commence his rubber, due to sudden illness, accidental disablement or any good and sufficient reason, a substitute player may take his place, providing that:

(a) the opposing captain agrees;

(b) proposed substitute is eligible under these By-Laws.

NOTE: If no substitute player is approved, a forfeit shall be given.

28. Match and Individual Walkovers.

(a) If any team receives a match walkover from any other team it shall be awarded all rubbers, games and points.

(b) In the event of a default occurring in any match which has commenced, the team not defaulting shall be awarded all uncompleted rubbers, games and points.

(c) In the event of a walkover of an individual rubber being given in a match which has already commenced, the team not defaulting shall also be awarded all rubbers, games and points competed for by the players at lower position in the two teams. The Pennant Committee may waive this ruling if the circumstances causing the walkover are deemed to be of an extreme or sound nature.

(d) If any team gives a match walkover the team's club shall be fined for each walkover up to two. In the event of third match walkover that team shall be disqualified and the member shall be liable for a further fine.

(e) In addition, each team which forfeits or grants a walkover will pay for each rubber forfeited or lost by walkover an amount equal to 25% of the cost of hiring a court for a complete pennant match. 29. Postponed Matches.

In the event of a match being postponed after play has commenced, all rubbers already decided shall stand.

30. Procedure for Conveyance of Correct Result.

(a) The captain of the winning team (or in the event of a drawn match, the home team), shall be responsible for conveying the match results to the appropriate records officer.

(b) The match result must be recorded on the official form for the competition and be a correct and complete record.

(c) Such results form shall be signed and certified correct by a member of each team and must be posted, at a post office no later than 9.00 a.m. on the morning following the match

(d) The Association may also require match results to be telephoned to the records officer, or his delegate, prior to a specified time limit.

1. Eligibility to Play in Finals.

(a) To be eligible to play in the final series of a grade, a player must have played at least 1/3rd of the total number of matches played by the team during the season. 1/3rd matches for a 14 week season implies 5 not 4, assuming no byes occur. Under special circumstances, however, the Pennant Committee may sanction the playing of players, who have not qualifed under this By-Law, in any match in the final series.

(b) Teams to be eligible to play in finals must have two (2) members who have:

i) Attained the accredited standard of refereeing

i) Passed the set written examination within the past two (2) years

OF

(iii) Attended a refereeing lecture and attempted to pass the set examination during the pennant season.

The above conditions apply to State Grades and the first four (4) Metropolitan Grades.

(c) No player, however, may play in the same final match of two grades.

32. Premiership Points.

For all matches played during the competition two points shall be awarded for a win, and one point for each rubber won. To decide the winner of any match, rubbers shall be first counted, then games and, if necessary, points. Unless otherwise decided by the Association prior to the commencement of the season, at the conclusion of the Home and Away matches the winner of the Pennant Premiership shall be decided by the following:—

Final Four:

4th team to play 3rd — Semi Final (S.F.) Winner S.F. to play 2nd — Preliminary Final (P.F.) Winner P.F. to play 1st — Grand Final

01

Final Three:

3rd Team to play 2nd — Semi Final (S.F.) Winner S.F. to play 1st — Grand Final

The Pennant Committee shall determine whether a final three/four will be played off, excepting in a ten team draw where a final four will be played.

33. Procedure if Teams Have Equal Points.

In the event of two or more teams being equal on premiership points at the conclusion of the Home and Away matches, the final order of such teams shall be determined by comparing the proportion of matches won to matches lost for each team and, if they be equal, the proportion of games won and lost shall then be compared: If the teams are still equal, then the proportion of points won and lost be compared. Any match walkovers, together with the corresponding match other teams involved in the calculation played against the team which had given the match walkover, shall be excluded from the calculation.

34. Promotion Principle.

The principle of promotion will be followed for all grades. In all grades of one section only, the premier team will be promoted to the next higher grade. In grades with sections, the premier teams will be promoted to the next higher grade. Notwithstanding anything contained in this rule, if the relative strength of any team in the following season has changed from the previous season so that

it is no longer considered by the Pennant Committee to be a team fitted for promotion, the Pennant Committee may set aside this principle. The exception to this principle shall apply to State 1st grade where, if the pennant committee considers that the premiership team from 2nd grade is not strong enough, that team will not gain promotion.

35. Colour of Players' Clothing.

Players are permitted to wear either:

(a) All white clothing;

(b) Club uniforms as approved by Council, or

(c) Coloured clothing excluding dark colours such as black, navy, dark brown or similar which may only be used on trims.

36. Non-eligibility of Pregnant Players.

Women who are obviously pregnant are not permitted to participate in Pennant Competition.



THE SINGLES GAME

1. The Game, How Played. The game of Squash Rackets is played between two players with standard rackets, with balls officially approved by I.S.R.F. and in a rectangular court of standard dimensions, enclosed on all four sides.

2. The Score. A match shall consist of the best of three or five games at the option of the promoters of the competition. Each game is 9 points up; that is to say, the player who first wins 9 points wins the game, except that, on the score being called 8-all for the first time, Hand-out may choose, before the next service is delivered, to continue the game to 10, in which case the player who first scores two more points, wins the game. Hand-out must in either case clearly indicate his choice to the Marker, if any, and to his opponent.

Note to Referees. If Hand-out does not make clear his choice before the next

service, the Referee shall stop play and require him to do so.

Points, How Scored. Points can only be scored by Hand-in. When a player fails to serve or to make a good return in accordance with the rules, the opponent wins the stroke. When Hand-in wins a stroke, he scores a point; when Hand-out wins a stroke, he becomes Hand-in.

4. The Right to Serve. The right to serve first is decided by the spin of a racket. Thereafter the server continues to serve until he loses a stroke, when his oppo-

nent becomes the server, and so on throughout the match.

5. Service. The ball before being struck shall be dropped or thrown in the air and shall not touch the walls or floor. The ball shall be served direct on to the front wall, so that on its return, unless volleyed, it would fall to the floor within the back quarter of the court opposite to the server's box from which the service has

At the beginning of each game and of each hand, the server may serve from either box, but after scoring a point he shall then serve from the other, and so on alternately as long as he remains Hand-in or until the end of the game. If the server serves from the wrong box, there shall be no penalty and the service shall count as if served from the correct box, except that Hand-out may, if he does not attempt to take the service, demand that it be served from the other box.

A player with the use of only one arm may utilise his racket to project the ball

into the air.

Good Service. A service is good which is not a fault or which does not result in the server serving his Hand-out in accordance with Rule 9. If the server serves one fault, he shall serve again.

Fault. A service is a fault (unless the server serves his Hand-out under Rule 9):

- (a) If the server fails to stand with at least one foot on the floor within, and not touching the line surrounding the service box at the moment of striking the ball (called a foot-fault).
- If the ball is served on to, or below, the cut line.

If the ball served first touches the floor on, or in front of, the short line or on

or outside the half court line.

Fault, if taken. Hand-out may take a fault. If he attempts to do so, the service thereupon becomes good and the ball continues in play. If he does not attempt to do so, the ball shall cease to be in play, provided that, if the ball, before it bounces twice upon the floor, touches the server or anything he wears or carries, the server shall lose the stroke.

Serving Hand-out. The server serves his Hand-out and loses the stroke:

- (a) If the ball is served on to, or below, the board, or out, or against any part of the court before the front wall.
- If the ball is not dropped or thrown in the air, or touches the wall or floor before being struck, or if he fails to strike the ball, or strikes it more than
- (c) If he serves two consecutive faults.

- (d) If the ball, before it has bounced twice upon the floor, or has been struck by his opponent, touches the server or anything he wears or carries.
- Let. A let is an undecided stroke, and the service or rally, in respect of which a
 let is allowed, shall not count and the server shall serve again from the same
 box. A let shall not annul a previous fault.

Note to Referees. This last sentence applies only to a second or subsequent service after a fault has not been taken.

11. The Play. After a good service has been delivered, the players return the ball alternately until one or other fails to make a good return, or the ball otherwise ceases to be in play in accordance with the rules.

12. Good Return. A return is good if the ball, before it has bounced twice upon the floor, is returned by the striker on to the front wall above the board, without touching the floor or any part of the striker's body or clothing, provided the ball is not hit twice or out.

Note to Referees. It shall not be considered a good return if the ball touches the board before or after it hits the front wall.

13. Strokes, How Won. A player wins a stroke:

(a) Under Rule 9.

(b) If the opponent fails to make a good return of the ball in play.

(c) If the ball in play touches his opponent or anything he wears or carries, except as is otherwise provided by Rules 14 and 15.

(d) If a stroke is awarded by the Referee as provided for in the Rules.

14. Hitting an Opponent with the Ball. If an otherwise good return of the ball has been made, but before reaching the front wall it hits the striker's opponent, or his racket, or anything he wears or carries, then:

(a) If the ball would have made a good return and would have struck the front wall without first touching any other wall, the striker shall win the stroke, except that, if the striker shall have followed the ball round, and so turned, before playing the ball, a let shall be allowed.

(b) If the ball would otherwise have made a good return, a let shall be allowed unless, in the Referee's opinion, a winning stroke has been intercepted, then the striker shall win the stroke.

(c) If the ball would not have made a good return, the striker shall lose the stroke. The ball shall cease to be in play, even if it subsequently goes up.

15. Further Attempts to Hit the Ball. If the striker strikes at, and misses the ball, he may make further attempts to return it. If, after being missed, the ball touches his opponent, or his racket, or anything he wears or carries, then:

(a) If the striker would otherwise have made a good return, a let shall be allowed

(b) If the striker could not have made a good return, he loses the stroke. If any such further attempt is successful, but the ball, before reaching the front wall, hits the striker's opponent, or his racket, or anything he wears or carries, a let shall be allowed and Rule 14(a)shall not apply.

16. Appeals.

 (a) An appeal may be made against any decision of the Marker, except for (b) (i) below.

 (i) No appeal shall be made in respect of the Marker's call of "foot-fault" or "fault" to the first service.

(ii) If the Marker calls "foot-fault" or "fault" to the second service, the server may appeal, and if the decision is reversed a let shall be allowed.

(iii) If the Marker allows the second service, Hand-out may appeal, either immediately, or at the end of the rally, if he has played the ball, and if the decision is reversed, Hand-in becomes Hand-out.

(iv) If the Marker does not call "foot-fault" or "fault" to the first service, Hand-out may appeal that the service was a "foot-fault" or "fault", provided he makes no attempt to play the ball. If the Marker does not call "Out" or "Not Up" to the first service, Hand-out may appeal, either immediately or at the end of the rally, if he has played the ball. In either case, if the appeal is disallowed, Hand-out shall lose the stroke.

(c) An appeal under Rule 12 shall be made at the end of the rally.

d) In all cases where a let is desired, an appeal shall be made to the Referee with the words "Let, please". Play shall thereupon cease until the Referee has given his decision.

(e) No appeal may be made after the delivery of a service for anything that occurred before that service was delivered.

17. Fair View and Freedom to Play the Ball.

(a) After playing a ball, a player must make every effort to get out of his opponent's way. That is:

 (i) A player must make every effort to give his opponent a fair view of the ball so that he may sight it adequately for the purpose of playing it.

(ii) A player must make every effort not to interfere with, or crowd, his opponent in the latter's attempt to get to, or play, the ball.

(iii) A player must make every effort to allow his opponent, as far as the latter's position permits, freedom to play the ball directly to the front wall, or side walls near the front wall.

(b) If any such form of interference has occurred, and, in the opinion of the Referee, the player has not made every effort to avoid causing it, the Referee shall on appeal, or stopping play without waiting for an appeal, award the stroke to his opponent.

(c) However, if interference has occurred, but in the opinion of the Referee the player has made every effort to avoid causing it, the Referee shall on appeal, or stopping play without waiting for an appeal, award a let, except that if his opponent is prevented from making a winning return by such interference or by distraction from the player, the Referee shall award the stroke to the opponent.

(d) When, in the opinion of the Referee, a player refrains from playing the ball which, if played, would clearly and undoubtedly have won the rally under the terms of Rule 14 (a) or (b), he shall be awarded the stroke.

Notes to Referees:

(i) The practice of impeding an opponent in his efforts to play the ball by crowding or obscuring his view, is highly detrimental to the game and Referees should have no hesitation in enforcing paragraph (b) above.

(ii) The words "interfere with" in (a) (ii) above must be interpreted to include the case of a player having to wait for an excessive swing of his opponent's racket.

18. Let, When Allowed. Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, and provided always that the striker could have made a good return:

(a) A let may be allowed:

(i) If, owing to the position of the striker, his opponent is unable to avoid being touched by the ball before the return is made.

Note to Referees: This rule shall be construed to include the cases of the striker, whose position in front of his opponent makes it impossible for the latter to see the ball, or who shapes as if to play the ball and changes his mind at the last moment, preferring to take the ball off the back wall, the ball in either case hitting his opponent, who is between the striker and the back wall. This is not, however, to be taken as conflicting in any way with the Referee's duties under

(ii) If the ball in play touches any articles lying in the court.

(iii) If the striker refrains from hitting the ball owing to a reasonable fear of injuring his opponent.

(iv) If the striker, in the act of playing the ball, touches his opponent.(v) If the Referee is asked to decide an appeal and is unable to do so.

(vi) If a player drops his racket, calls out or in any other way distracts his

opponent, and the Referee considers that such occurrence has caused the opponent to lose the stroke.

(b) A Let shall be allowed:

(i) If Hand-out is not ready and does not attempt to take the service.

(ii) If a ball breaks during play.

(iii) If an otherwise good return has been made but the ball goes out of court on its first bounce.

(iv) As provided for in Rules 14, 15, 16 (b) (ii), 23 and 24.

- No let shall be allowed when a player has made an attempt to play the ball except as provided for under Rules 15, 18 (a) (iv), 18 (b) (ii) and 18 (b) (iii).
- Unless an appeal is made by one of the players, no let shall be allowed except where these rules definitely provide for a let, namely Rules 14 (a) and (b), 17 and 18 (b) (ii) and (iii).
- 19. New Ball. At any time, when the ball is not in actual play, a new ball may be substituted by mutual consent of the players, or, on appeal by either player, at the discretion of the Referee.

Knock-up. 20.

Immediately preceeding the start of play, the Referee shall allow on the court of play a period not exceeding five minutes to the two players together for the purpose of knocking-up, or in the event of the players electing to knock-up separately, the Referee shall allow the first player a period of 31/2 minutes and to his opponent 21/2 minutes. In the event of a separate knock-up, the choice of knocking-up first shall be decided by the spin of a racket. The Referee shall allow a further period for the players to warm the ball up if the match is being resumed after a considerable delay.

Where a new ball has been substituted under Rule 18 (b) (ii) or 19, the Referee shall allow the ball to be knocked-up to playing condition. Play shall resume on the direction of the Referee, or prior mutual consent of the

- Between games the ball shall remain on the floor of the court in view and knocking-up shall not be permitted except by mutual consent of the players.
- 21. Play in a Match to be Continuous. After the first service is delivered, play shall be continuous so far as is practical, provided that:
 - (a) At any time play may be suspended owing to bad light or other circumstances beyond the control of the players, for such period as the Referee shall decide. In the event of play being suspended for the day, the match shall start afresh, unless both players agree to contrary.

The Referee shall award a game to the opponent of any player who, in his opinion, persists, after due warning, in delaying play in order to recover his

strength or wind, or for any other reason.

An interval of one minute shall be permitted between games and of two minutes between the fourth and fifth games of a five-game match. A player may leave the court during such intervals but shall be ready to resume play at the end of the stated time. When ten seconds of the interval permitted between games are left, the Marker shall call "Ten Seconds" to warn the players to be ready to resume play. Should either player fail to do so when required by the Referee, a game may be awarded to opponent.

In the event of an injury, the Referee may require a player to continue play or concede the match, except where the injury is contributed to by his opponent, or where it was caused by dangerous play on the part of the opponent. In the former case, the Referee may allow time for the injured player to receive attention and recover, and in the latter, the injured player shall be

awarded the match under Rule 24 (d) (ii).

In the event of a ball breaking, a new ball may be knocked-up as provided for in Rule 20 (b).

Notes to Referees:

(i) In allowing time for a player to receive attention and recover, the Referee should ensure that there is no conflict with the obligation of a player to comply with Rule 21 (b), that is, that the effects of the injury are not exaggerated and used as an excuse to recover strength or

(ii) The Referee should not interpret the words "contributed to" by the opponent to include the situation where the injury to the player is a result of that player occupying an unnecessarily close position to his

opponent.

22. Control of a Match. A match is normally controlled by a Referee, assisted by a Marker. One person may be appointed to carry out the functions of both Referee and Marker. When a decision has been made by a Referee, he shall announce it to the players and the Marker shall repeat it with the subsequent score. Up to one hour before the commencement of a match either player may request

a Referee and/or a Marker other than appointed, and this request may be considered and a substitute appointed. Players are not permitted to request any such change after the commencement of a match, unless both agree to do so. In either case the decision as to whether an official is to be replaced or not must re-

main in the hands of Tournament Referee, where applicable.

Duties of Marker.

- (a) The Marker calls the play and the score, with the server's score first. He shall call "Fault", "Foot-fault", "Out", "Not up" or "Down" as ap-
- If in the course of play the Marker calls "Not up", "Out" or "Down" or in the case of a second service "Fault" or "Foot-fault" then the rally shall
- If the Marker's decision is reversed on appeal, a let shall be allowed, except as provided for in Rule 24 (b) (iv) and (v).

Any service or return shall be considered good unless otherwise called.

After the server has served a fault, which has not been taken, the Marker shall repeat the score and add the words "One fault" before the server serves again. This call should be repeated should subsequent rallies end in a let, until the point is finally decided.

When no Referee is appointed, the Marker shall exercise all the powers of

If the Marker is unsighted or uncertain, he shall call on the Referee to make the relevant decision; if the latter is unable to do so, a let shall be allowed.

24. Duties of Referee:

- (a) The Referee shall award Lets and Strokes and make decisions where called for by the rules, and shall decide all appeals, including those against the Marker's calls and decisions. The decision of the Referee shall be final.
- He shall in no way intervene in the Marker's calling except:
 - (i) Upon appeal by one of the players.

(ii) As provided for in Rule 17.

- (iii) When it is evident that the score has been incorrectly called, in which case he should draw the Marker's attention to the fact.
- When the Marker has failed to call the ball "Not up", "Out" or "Down" and on appeal he rules that such was in fact the case, the stroke should be awarded accordingly.
- (v) When the Marker has called "Not up", "Out" or "Down" and on appeal he rules that this was not the case, a Let shall be allowed except that if in the Referee's opinion the Marker's call had interrupted an undoubted winning return, he shall award the stroke accordingly.

(vi) In exceptional circumstances when he is absolutely convinced that the Marker has made an obvious error in stopping play or allowing play to

continue, he shall immediately rule accordingly.

- (c) The Referee is responsible that all times laid down in the rules are strictly adhered to.
- (d) In exceptional cases, the Referee may order:
 - (i) A player, who has left the court, to play on.
 - (ii) A player to leave the court and to award the match to the opponent.
 - (iii) A match to be awarded to a player whose opponent fails to be present in court within ten minutes of advertised time of play.
 - (iv) Play to be stopped in order to warn that the conduct of one or both of the players is leading to an infringement of the rules. A Referee should avail himself of this rule as early as possible when either player is showing a tendency to break the provisions of Rule 17.
- (e) If after a warning a player continues to contravene Rule 20 (c) the Referee shall award a game to the opponent.
- 25. Colour of Players' Clothing. For amateur events under the control of the I.S.R.F. players are required to wear all white clothing, provided however, the I.S.R.F. officers at their sole discretion can waive compliance with this rule.

Member countries of the I.S.R.F. may legislate, if they so desire, to allow clothing of a light pastel colour to be worn for all other events under their control.

The Referee's decision thereon to be final.

Note: Footwear is deemed clothing for this rule.


